YOUR CONSERVATIVE COUNCIL

As Conservatives we believe in value for money as well as open, transparent and effective democracy. That is why as Conservatives we have eliminated unnecessary and wasteful expenditure from Elmbridge Borough Council achieving savings of nearly £10 million over the past 7 years. We have also delivered on our pledge to reduce the size of the Council (it had the most elected Councillors in Surrey). This is why the whole Council is up for election. Elmbridge continues to be not only one of the highest performing Councils in the country but also one of the most sought after boroughs to live in. This year will see a reduction in central government funding of £550k which is 28% less than we received last year (Elmbridge now receives just £21 towards the £125 annual spend per resident). To cover a proportion of that shortfall we are having to increase the Elmbridge element of the Council Tax by £3.93 per year for a Band D household. This will ensure we can continue to deliver those vital services you rightly expect from your Council.

OUR ACHIEVEMENTS

Since taking control of the council we have

- Invested in the improvement of our town centres through grants from the Elmbridge Civic Improvement Fund.
- Achieved zero Borough Council Tax increases in 7 out of the last 10 years (the Residents' Political Parties put up taxes in 12 out of 13 years).
- Given local communities access to funding for improvements to their locality through the Community Infrastructure Levy.
- Increased funding to the voluntary sector and provided use of the Elmbridge Community Hub.
- Worked closely with our partners to provide in excess of 1000 affordable homes in the borough.
- Put the Council on a strong financial footing with robust governance and accountability.
- Seen the level of residents' satisfaction with our services rise to an all time high of 88%.
- Planned to start the building of a state-of-the-art Sports Hub in Walton.
- Reviewed all key contracts for example. waste collection, maintenance of green spaces and CCTV monitoring - to deliver the best value for money.
- Pursued joint working with other local authorities, Surrey Police and key stakeholders to provide more effective services.

CARING AND CAMPAIGNING IN MOLESEY WEST

MOLESEY HOSPITAL

Molesey Hospital delivers care closer to home for our residents and eases the pressure on beds at Kingston Hospital. We are horrified to hear that it is being considered for closure and will fight for it to remain open and to receive the investment it deserves. Should the closure occur, we will push for the site to continue to be used to provide local healthcare and services in West Molesey.



ROADS AND PARKING

We will seek to positively influence Surrey County Council's review of parking in Molesey this summer to address pinch points such as the shops in Central Avenue. The Conservatives in power at County Hall are also investing £100m to resurface and repair roads, with many including Island Farm Road now complete. There is much more to be done to address potholes



and safety blackspots but funding is finite. West Molesey needs councillors who will lobby and persuade Surrey to direct resources where they are needed locally.

SCHOOLS AND YOUNG PEOPLE

We understand the key importance of providing high quality education for all ages in our community and will be vocal in making sure Molesey children have access to the best local schools. We support Surrey County Council's efforts to create additional, much-needed classroom places, and welcome the new Hurst Park School. Cars still pass it at dangerous speeds, so we will press for signage. As well as supporting existing



Molesey schools we are keen to see a secondary school established for Molesey children. Outside of school hours, Scouting in Molesey is thriving and as councillors we would support and encourage this.

MOLESEY HEATH

Molesey Heath is a beautiful area which is enjoyed by dog walkers and residents of all ages. As one of our area's valued open spaces it should be

maintained and protected. At the moment it is not as well used as it could be due to the lack of parking facilities. We will press the council to create a modest number of car parking spaces on existing hard standing to improve community usage and take the pressure off residential streets.
