My 6-Point Plan for Weybridge Riverside

- 1 Parking issues** - I strongly support the excellent work carried out by the Weybridge Society to address this long-standing issue and I am committed to working with community organisations to find a sustainable solution.
- 2 Weybridge walk in centre** - this is a well used local facility that needs to be re-provided. I am committed to doing all I can to lobby the agencies involved so they are in no doubt as to how important it is to Weybridge.
- 3 Potholes** - there cannot be many residents in our Weybridge community who do not feel the impact of potholes on a daily basis. I will continue to work hard to secure funding from Elmbridge and Surrey to have at least two of the worst affected roads in our area resurfaced, the Seven Hills Road and St Georges Avenue.
- 4 Library** - our Weybridge library is a key resource for our town and is the second most used library in the Borough. I am committed to ensuring that we secure appropriate funding from Surrey County Council to improve our facilities and protect its future.
- 5 Brooklands traffic congestion** - Brooklands is a valuable local amenity which many of our residents and businesses enjoy and take advantage of. However, traffic congestion here is a problem. Our Conservative group is committed to improving this situation and to finding a workable solution to ease this problem.
- 6 Rylston House Registry Office** - given the strength of feeling surrounding the possibility of the Registry Office being sold and re-located, I am committed to ensuring that we protect this piece of Weybridge heritage.
