DEVELOPMENT AT HAMPTON COURT STATION: YOUR VIEWS

Local Conservative candidate Xingang Wang is asking for residents' views on proposed major development at Hampton Court Station.

Plans have been submitted to Elmbridge Borough Council for a major redevelopment of land around Hampton Court Station.

If the scheme by Alexpo and Network Rail goes ahead, it would see 97 new apartments, an 84-bedroom hotel, a café and a small supermarket built, in addition to station improvements and a reworking of the traffic gyratory on Hampton Court Way. A new public open space connected to Cigarette Island Park would be created.

However, there are significant concerns in the community about the height and density of the scheme and whether the proposed 207 parking spaces will be sufficient.

Xingang Wang is your Conservative candidate in this May's Borough Council elections. The primary role of your local councillor is to represent your views. That's why Xingang would like to know your thoughts on the proposed Hampton Court Station developments.

What's being proposed?



- Hoardings replaced by a public square
- 97 one and two-bed apartments
- 84 bedroom hotel
- 207 space car park (57 resident spaces)
- 180 cycle spaces
- Retail unit and café
- Reworked gyratory with traffic lights by Bridge
- 1.7m higher than previous permitted scheme

TAKING A STAND AGAINST AIRCRAFT NOISE

We know that aircraft noise is a growing problem in East Molesey Planes departing from Heathrow when the wind is from the East are routed over our community. New Performance- Based Navigation (PBN) could lead to even greater concentration. Your Conservative councillors and MP are continuing to engage with Heathrow and press for respite periods and the principles of fair dispersal not concentration of noise.

Councillor Steve Bax has chaired a committee to draft Elmbridge Borough Council's official response to Heathrow's most recent public consultation. He says: "We have come out very strongly against their new plans to use both existing runways for early morning landings. This would mean planes over Molesey 70% of the year from 5.15am. This is unacceptable and we strongly object."

"We also opposed any increase in easterly operations which would result in more noise for Molesey. East Molesey County Councillor Peter Szanto is also fighting our corner at the Heathrow Community Noise Forum and at Surrey. We look forward to Xingang Wang being elected to strengthen our team."

Boost for neighbourhood policing

Surrey's Conservative Police and Crime Commissioner, David Munro, is recruiting 100 extra front-line officers, staff and PCSOs. He is seeking to bolster crime prevention, neighbourhood policing and protections for vulnerable people.

While there is no room for complacency, it is welcome news that residential burglaries in Elmbridge were down 20.8% between April and December last year, compared to the previous year. This is 126 fewer properties burgled.

Protecting our riverside

Elmbridge Conservatives secured a three-year ban on unauthorised encampments and we are now leading the battle to protect our riverside. In Molesey our councillors continue to apply pressure to the Environment Agency to step up legal action against the unsightly commercial hotel boats, which are moored without permission near Hampton Court.

This situation has gone on far too long and caused much distress to our residents. We will not let it drop until it is resolved. In addition Xingang Wang and Cllr Steve Bax are also working with the Reclaim Our Riverside campaign to tackle the issue of our riverbank being fenced-off by occupants of boats moored on unregistered land.

NEW LEADERSHIP FOR ELMBRIDGE

Elmbridge Conservatives have elected James Browne as their new leader.

James is hugely experienced, having served on the Council as Cobham's representative for 11 years, and was until recently the Cabinet Member for Planning.

As head of the largest party, he also becomes Leader of Elmbridge Council and is promising to carefully manage the Borough's finances with a laser-like focus on eliminating waste.

James says: "Elmbridge is one of the best places in the country to live, but I am also acutely aware of how difficult it can be to get on the housing ladder. If a Conservative administration is re-elected in May - with Xingang Wang as part of it - we will provide more starter homes while also protecting our precious parks and green belt."

Cllr Ruth Mitchell, Cabinet Member for Resources, will be working with James as Deputy Leader.
